## BILL COLLINS



With his passing away earlier this year, Pyles Camp lost one of its staunchest supporters and dearest friends in Bill Collins.

From his first contact with the Camp in its early days he became a generous donor and strong supporter. When he retired from Standard Oil and was elected to the Camp's Board of Directors in 1965, he literally dedicated the rest of his life to the Camp.

As a member of the Finance Committee, Bill regularly solicited, cajoled and even demanded support for the Camp from men and women throughout the oil industry. A tireless worker, he never demanded more from anyone than from himself.

In 1972, Bill Collins obtained the first of the Camp's electrical generators, and all of the subsequent ones including those now in use. He also obtained the free donation of diesel fuel every year to run the generators. When the generator building was completed in 1982, largely through donations of time, money and materials he had solicited as well as his own generosity, the Camp was honored to name it for him.

Mr. Collins served as well as chairman of the Equipment and Maintenance Committee from 1977 until his death; chairman of the Alternate Campsite Committee from 1972 to 1974; and he served as Vice President of the Board from 1972 until he succeeded to the Presidency in 1974, serving as President until 1976.

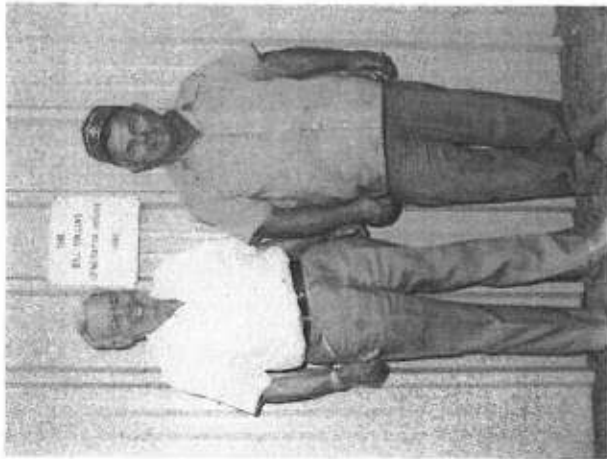
Bill was a friend of the Camp unlike any other. We were very lucky to have him, and we will miss him.

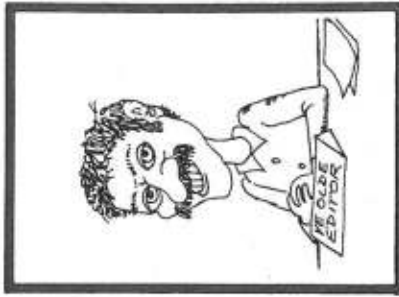
## What's a PYLET?

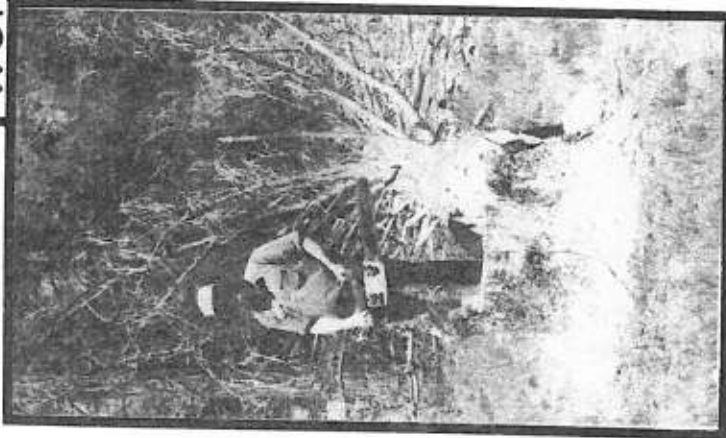
# WORK PARTIES!
