Dedication to Smokey




In the summer of 1987, I came into the camp much like most every camper, going through some hard times as my parents were

Rion Meadows

Lion Meadows is a powerful place, located deep in the Golden Trout Wilderness. Lion Meadows has only a few rustic cabins, a wood burning stove that we cook over, and some furniture carved from Ponderosa Pines. The Lion Meadows experience is unlike any other, but the experience depends greatly on the group itself. To get the most out of Lion Meadows we look for individuals who have a desire to be there, a willingness to open for those who have the potential to work hard and be positive leaders. From Lion Meadows you could become a worker.

While at Lion Meadows you are expected to help with the daily duties. We cook all our meals over a wood burning stove, we collect our own wood and we all help with the K.P. There are no activities like at main camp and, sadly enough, Nana is not there either.

Because of the way Lion Meadows is set up, we become a close family, relying on and helping each other experience success.


