

## Juan "Deck" Herrera





Living in a rough part of town,


Deck is faced with many pressures of the city on a daily basis. But due to his strong desire to be successful in his life and to make a difference in the lives around him





# Lion Meadows

Lion Meadows is a very different experience from main camp. There are no Specialists, no hot showers, no electricity, and no Nana! (How will we survive!) What we do have is a beautiful alpine meadow with a sparkling stream running down the middle of it, a very rustic cook cabin, and shelters. And most important we have each other. As the sessions progress the Lioneers and their counselors become as close as a family. They learn to work fogether, cook on a wood stove, drink from a moun tain stream, participate in new and exciting activities, and pull together as a team. Lioneers spend mo time in the wilderness and go much farther than any main camp group. They experience all the wonders of nature, from mid-summer snow storms to fishing in a lakes over 10,000 feet in elevation. It is rugged and physical experience but, without exception, every Lioneer has been glad he took the challenge.

If you want to accept this challenge there are some steps you need to take. First write camp an let us know you are interested. Take the lessons you learned at camp and apply them to your life. Keep writing and let us know how you are doing and what changes you are making to improve yourself. We will also need copies of your report cards so keep working hard in school. Even if you wer not recommended by your counselor you may still be able to become a Lioneer. Just start making positive changes in your life and write camp. Lion Meadows is an opportunity of a lifetime. Accept






