



# Enjoy the Strawberry



# Lion Meadows Program Stepped Up And Over Came The Challenges This Summer

### High Water & Lightening Fire...

This summer Mother Nature presented all of our groups with some challenges, but the Lioneers felt the biggest impact. They had to deal with very high water levels in the rivers and a lightening fire that started near our Lion Meadows property.

The winter last year brought with it a higher then normal snowfall, which was great as the backcountry needed the water, but it also resulted in very high run off in the rivers. Due to the high waters many outcamp locations and river crossings were closed to all our groups for the majority of the summer for safety reasons. This made for longer hikes to get to Lion meadows and limited where groups could camp.

Around the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> Session, during a storm, lighting hit a tree about a half-mile below Lion Meadows. The Forest Service decided to manage this fire, and let it burn under control. We allowed them to use Lion Meadows as their firebase to stage crews and equipment. Due to the fires proximity to the Lion Meadows and the number of fire fighters flying in and out we were no longer able to use Lion the rest of the summer.

This made for some challenges of running the last three sessions of Lioneers, but there will be several



positives for our future at Lion Meadows. With the fire being so close the fire fighters let the fire come through our property burning off around 90 years worth of ground debris and about 150 slash piles from tree thinning and cleaning we have been doing. Now that everything has been burnt off, Lion Meadows is much safer from future fires and looks AMAZING!



### Much Needed Campsite Clean-up....

Part of the Lion Meadows program is to do various conservation projects within Lion Meadows or on the trail. Part of the Pyles Camp philosophy is to leave an area cleaner and better then we found it. With the fire near Lion Meadows and not being able to use our property or that area of the backcountry, we had to quickly figure out how to keep the program running for the remainder of the summer.

Thoughts and ideas were put together, but mostly through the efforts of McFly and Cloud they were able to base the Lioneers out of the main camp and have them clean and improve the campsites

while on their outcamp trips.



Special recognition goes to the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> session Lioneers and staff for cleaning up all the campsites in the basin and along 20 miles of trail between camp and Kern Lakes. Along with all their camping gear, these guys hauled rakes, shovels, buckets and gloves with them, stopping at each campsite along the way cleaning it up and making improvements. We are sure there are many hikers out there that will enjoy coming to a campsite after a long day on the trail that will enjoy your efforts.

# Voyagers





# Pyles Leadership Training

### Developing the Pyles Family leaders

The PLT program is an intense leadership program utilizing a classroom setting (including lecture and group discussion), practical exercises and observation of experienced counselors at work with their groups in order to prepare these young men for the tremendous challenges of the counselor position. The PLT's also participate in an outcamp experience where they have the opportunity to deal with different scenarios that may arise when they become counselors.

Every year a special group of young men are selected to participate in the training challenging them to be the best. Selection to be a counselor is not guaranteed as a right of passage, but a privilege based on an individual's work ethic, desire and enthusiasm. It is important to fully develop the *leadership*, *decision making*, *and safety* skills in these young men to insure that they are prepared to provide the most enjoyable and rewarding experience for the campers. Expectations for our counselors are very high, and the program is designed to identify and develop new leaders within the Pyles family.

The training was provided by *Coach*, *Hondo*, *and Cloud*. Coach has been the lead instructor for the past 16 years, as well as, the person responsible for the development and continual updating of the course. Hondo is an alumnus of the camp, a selector, an LA County Sheriff's Sergeant, and a PLT instructor for 3 years. Cloud has been with camp for many years, most recently as a PLT instructor for 3 years, as well as, the Lion Meadows Director.






































# BBO's & Volunteers
